that are no longer working.

HOW TO CHECK IF MY ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT CLASSED AS WEEE

If you believe that the equipment is no longer usable and would be classed as waste, then this would be classed as WEEE. If you think that that the equipment could still be used (assets), we can help with this if you send us a list or pictures of the equipment that is being assessed.

IS ELECTRONIC WASTE CLASSED AS HAZARDOUS?

Since July 2019 Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPS) directive in WEEE has come into place. This means unless it can be proven that there is no Persistent Organic Pollutants in the plastics then this has to be assumed to contain it. Some other hazardous chemicals in WEEE can include Lead Phosphor, Mercury, CFC'S (Chlorofluorocarbon), PCB'S (Polychlorinated Biphenyl's) as well as asbestos along with a couple more chemicals.

HOW CAN YOU RECYCLE OUR OLD EQUIPMENT?

When we can look at your equipment, we will be able to find out if your item is an asset or a waste stream. If we think your equipment is an asset we will refurbish and re-use it. If the item is not reusable, then the material will be sent off for incineration which then produces renewable energy.

WHAT HAPPENS WITH DATA OR HARD DRIVES THAT I MAY HAVE?

We have a service called data destruction whereby the data devices and hard drives are shredded instead of being re used. By doing this we are taking away any potential security risks whilst being GDPR compliant.
